THE LIMESTONE MUSIC FESTIVAL will take place on 22nd June 2013 in the Creswell Social Centre beginning at 4pm to 11.30pm. Tickets are now on sale at Limestone House.

Bands at the Music Festival are Cold Gin, Monkeys Uncles, The Sons of El Roacho, The Cycle Paths, JATO, Haworth Ward-Drummond and Behind the Blind. There will be real ale and ciders available, plus food on sale. This is a fundraising event and the income raised will be put towards the sustainability of Limestone House and Limestone Studio for the benefit of the community and the surrounding area.

The Limestone House Heritage Centre currently has a display about the famous Creswell Colliery Band thanks to the Elmton with Creswell Local History Group. The photographs, from their archives, show the famous trombone quartet, many photographs of the Band in its heyday and the development of the Creswell Junior Band from the 1970s. The Heritage Centre shows the unique geology of the limestone ridge running through this area and shows the chapters of heritage from the Ice Age through to the Mining era. The Multipurpose Centre is open on Monday to Friday from 9am to 4.30pm and on Saturday mornings from 9am to 12noon and houses a Coffee shop, Charity Shop and a 2nd hand book shop and is certainly worth a visit.

The Friends of Thynghowe
 Thynghowe and the forgotten heritage of Sherwood

Mansfield Museum will be featuring a display about Thynghowe and the past of the Forest of Birklands throughout most of June. It will include the results of our latest research, particularly focusing on the Viking age.

We hope that a recent Viking find from a nearby site will also be displayed. This will be the last public event of our Heritage Lottery project 'Thynghowe and the forgotten heritage of Sherwood' and we are planning to include some of the work produced by the local junior schools who visited the Forest to find out about the past of our local woodlands.

On the first day at the museum, Saturday June 1st, we will be launching our new booklet that relates stories from Birklands Forest and everybody is welcome to come along and meet us around 11am. This will also be a chance to celebrate of the success of the project and we hope that many of the folk who participated will join us.

During the sixteen months of this project the workshops, archive sessions, guided walks and surveying sessions have attracted an attendance of over 150 people. In addition, a couple of hundred more must have attended talks given to local community groups and over a hundred school children have taken part in activities in the Forest. Many more have followed our progress online or attended the Spring Thing at Sherwood Pines.

Although our Heritage Lottery funding is now ending we will continue our work with the enthusiastic team that has grown during this project. Watch out for our events once the woodland archaeology season starts again in the autumn.
