LESSON 9 ~ WATER & REFLECTIONS

The way to make water look like water is to add reflections to it. Reflections of trees, buildings etc.

Never paint a river straight blue as it will look flat. A river reflects the sky, use similar colours as your sky, to paint a river.

Pic 1. Posts & Reflections



Mix the following colours: (see previous lesson on mixing colours)

- 1, BLACK (FRENCH ULTRAMARINE BLUE & BURNT SIENNA).
- 2, FRENCH ULTRAMARINE BLUE (quite a watery mixture).

Paint the water with your NUMBER 10 BRUSH & the FRENCH ULTRAMARINE COLOUR. Allow this to dry, then paint the figures & the posts in BLACK with your NUMBER 5 BRUSH. Again allow this to dry.

There are two ways of painting reflections, A WASH REFLECTION (Pic 3) and a WET ON WET REFLECTION (Pic 4). A wet on wet reflection is by far the best & most natural looking way.

(Pic 1) shows two posts at the waterside, and their reflections. The ripple effect on the water is achieved with your NUMBER 5 BRUSH, painting in a left to right action, using the tip of your brush.

A WASH REFLECTION



Add some CLEAR WATER to the BLACK COLOUR to water it down. Then paint the ripple reflection with this colour & your NUMBER 5 BRUSH.



As with skies, WET ON WET TECHNIQUE (See previous lesson on techniques) is by far the best and most realistic way of painting water / reflections.

There is no reason why you cannot paint a river etc that incorporates both a WET ON WET REFLECTION and a WASH REFLECTION. Always paint the WET ON WET wash first, allow this to dry and then apply

the second WASH REFLECTION.

A WASH REFLECTION, sometimes works better than a WET ON WET REFLECTION. It can be quite difficult to decide which technique to use. In time you will learn which technique is the best.

A good rule to follow is, WET ON WET REFLECTIONS work best on rivers that have a lot of reflections in them (Pic 5). WASH REFLECTIONS work best on scenes with fewer reflections in them.

(Pic 3 & 4) Shows two posts (Pic 3) that has been painted using the WASH REFLECTION technique, and the post in (Pic4) has been painted using the WET ON WET REFLECTION technique.

To paint a WET ON WET REFLECTION you must firstly paint all the river area with clear water (the same as you would with a wet on wet sky), then apply the required colours eg the sky colours and the trees etc, while the clear water is still wet. This allows the paint to run more freely. Once this is dry you can add any finishing touches, like darker tones.
